Key Recommendations WG3



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On a Member state level

- Minimal requirements for Quality Assurance System
 - Legally based judicial or administrative authority
 - Certification of individual judicial experts
 - Accreditation of Judicial Expert Service Providers
 - Regular (re)assessment of individual judicial experts and Judicial Expert Service Providers
- The creation and maintenance of a register on judicial expertise in each EU member state
 - Minimal details of each individual judicial expert in register



Legal authority: basics



- Legally based framework
- Involvement of individual judicial experts, Judicial Expert Service Providers, professional bodies, judges, lawyers and other.
- ≻Public (EU) funding



Legal Authority: tasks



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Set basic quality standards

- applicable for all judicial experts
- certification of individual judicial experts
- accreditation for Judicial Expert Service Providers
- for specific fields of expertise (In addition to general CEN/ISO standards)
- Hold and maintain a register of certified individual judicial experts and accredited Judicial Expert Service Providers
- Set the basic curriculum for the judicial training of judicial experts
- Set procedures for the assessment and re-assessment of individual judicial experts and Judicial Expert Service Providers
- Set a Code of Conduct which applies to all judicial experts





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Quality most not only be done, but also seen to be done !





Criteria for accreditation



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Judicial Expert Service Providers should:

>have implemented a quality management system:

- develop or accept the competency requirements
- guarantee that its employees comply with these requirements
- Training and assessment of judicial experts
- Periodic (re)assessment
- employ individual judicial experts who have signed a statement

have safeguarded that its results cannot be influenced by improper pressure or interests.



Individual Judicial Expert: Certification



- Have sufficient knowledge, experience and skills in their field of expertise;
- ➤Have sufficient knowledge, experience and skills in the field of law concerned and are sufficiently familiar with the role of the expert in this field.
- >Continuing Professional Development;
- Provide evidence of expertise and recent assignments
- ➢Give in writing, and orally if required, a verifiable, wellreasoned and well-documented report;
- Complete an assignment within the stipulated or agreed period;
- >Professional attitude;





Individual Judicial Expert: Certification



- ➤The adoption of a Code of Conduct;
- ➤An official certificate should be delivered by the authorities giving proof of good behaviour and morals;
- ➤An individual judicial expert should sign a statement that they comply with a Code of conduct and generally accepted best practices that are in line with the EU Code of Conduct for judicial experts;
- Personal reference;
- Adequate professional indemnity insurance for the activities of judicial experts.




